

# THE PERFECT PLACE

Hawthorn Park comprises four interconnected buildings of 345 luxurious one, two and three bedroom residences including apartments, townhouses and retail tenancies. The project features a glass bottomed sky pool that bridges two of the buildings, landscaped public piazzas, and exclusive facilities such as a wellness retreat with a state-of-the-art gym, yoga studio and massage rooms.

Covering a massive 12,600m<sup>2</sup> footprint in a prime location in Melbourne's inner suburb of Hawthorn, Hawthorn Park is a prestigious new residential development designed by RotheLoweman Architects which invites serenity with a lush landscaping concept designed by award winning landscape architect Jack Merlo.

The project incorporates 345 premium one, two and three-bedroom apartments and townhouses featuring premium finishes and high quality appliances from manufacturers including Miele and Gaggenau. The site also includes retail tenancies within the footprint.

The apartments are divided between four towers ranging between 3-levels and 6-levels over a 2-level basement carpark and set within the landscaped garden which is open to the public during the day and provides a pedestrian access route between Camberwell Road and Burwood Road.

The buildings are crowned by exclusive amenities such as a wellness retreat, garden lounges and a rooftop common area which includes a highlight of the project, Melbourne's first sky pool which bridges two of the towers and is suspended over the garden area below.

Hickory rationalised the pool design to improve buildability and introduce prefabrication for some key elements. "The swimming pool was a difficult one and to get it from the concept on paper to a reality

was a huge process," said Julie Radonic, Project Manager. "We finally got there – it was a great feat for everyone involved and when the pool went in lots of people lined the footpath to watch!"

Another key feature of the project is the balustrade 'ribbons' on each floor which curve along their length and also undulate up and down with glass infills. Hickory offered an inhouse façade solution to enable delivery of the intricate textured façade using GRC components.

"There was 2.5km of ribbon in the project and it was all designed and manufactured overseas," said Julie. "That meant it had to be fabricated spot on and we were very happy that in the end every single panel fit!"

The architectural concept of Hawthorn Park was inspired by the stepped terraces of rice paddy fields and Macchu Picchu.

"Every level of the building has a different footprint and the lack of repeatability in the structure between each floor created some challenges," said Julie. "The curved façades added further complexity for the construction."

Construction started in January 2019 and was completed early 2021. COVID-19 added further challenges to the construction process. "One of the biggest difficulties was the uncertainty," said Julie. "We had issues with the supply chain and mitigated those

through careful management. Construction continued throughout the lockdown but we reduced the workforce in line with government guidance."


Construction was aided by the two street frontages of the site. "The multiple frontages meant that we could use three cranes at a time which gave us dual lifting capability," explained Julie. "We engaged closely with VicRoads to ensure we didn't cause any congestion to traffic flow."

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
