

Lindfield Village Green is a vibrant public space that will play a central role in community life for residents, staff, commuters, shoppers and visitors in the area. The construction includes a public plaza, a pavilion suitable for a café or restaurant, market, outdoor cinema, live performances capabilities, and a three level underground car park with 280 spaces.

Multi-award-winning and privately owned construction company Kane Constructions was awarded the full Design and Construct contract by Ku-ring-gai Council. Kane is synonymous for delivering large scale, first class projects across all sectors of the construction industry. The latest undertaking at Lindfield Village Green is no exception.

The project, which took approximately 18 months to build, was designed to provide residents and commuters with a vibrant, safe and meaningful public space.

Positioned to play a central role in the local area, the site occupies approximately 5,350m² and includes full amenities, lift and stair access and an open, fully landscaped green space on ground level which was created with easy pedestrian movement and social gatherings in mind.

Brad Mason, NSW Operations Manager at Kane Constructions spent the final six months of the build on-site full-time and led a team of 12 labourers and project managers monitoring costs, safety and the programming of all works. "The new underground car park has a total of 280 spaces across three levels and we've included solar panels on the ground floor which feed into the electric vehicle chargers," said Brad Mason.

"A typical day for me started with a pre-team meeting at 6.00am where we would assign the tasks for the day and discuss how to best manage the works on-site. Despite delays due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the project was delivered on time. This is a credit to everyone involved."

Lindfield Village Green is located in a very built-up area. It is for this reason that the

green space was a priority for the community. "The grassed garden area on the ground floor includes a copper-clad café and gazebos with vines and lights." Brad said. "For the people that live in the area, particularly the elderly population and for those who don't have a garden, this space will play an important role."

Lindfield Village Green is a modern example of sustainable urbanism. The project showcases water sensitive urban design boasting an on-site water recycling system, water capture, storage and reuse, and water conservation systems.

Essential to the success of the project was the effective communication between Kane, Ku-ring-gai Council, consultants and the team of subcontractors. Regular newsletters and updates were distributed to all stakeholders.

"We used a number of trusted and reliable subcontractors that we've worked with before. Our team shared the vision to deliver a sustainable and exciting transformation for the community. Regular and detailed communication was maintained with the local council for the projects duration." Brad said.

"We had several working committees in place and a key focus for our Site Manager was to meet the surrounding and adjoining neighbours on a regular basis to manage issues that arose during the construction phase. We were successful in minimising disruption to the surrounding environment."

Kane's long list of industry accolades includes the 2016 and 2019 National Construction Master Builder of the Year, as well as Master Builder of the Year in Victoria in 2016, 2017 and 2019.

"We installed the Schneider ELV car charging system at the Lindfield Village Green which was a first for us and it's a big part of the transformation of the area which now accommodates 3-levels of car parking, as well as a café and green area on the ground floor."

Aled's role as Project Manager meant that he spent a great deal of time onsite, working alongside the site supervisor to manage the progress of his team and any issues that needed working out. This sound communication between Ergo Group and Kane Constructions was essential, particularly when COVID restrictions came into play and design meetings with all stakeholders were moved to an online format.

"Another challenge that we faced on this project was getting all of our cabling into the concrete walls and ceilings and because of the detailed architectural lighting throughout, we had to meticulously plan all of our cable routes and get them installed in the deck work prior to any of the concrete pours," Aled explained. "We are extremely happy that all of the cabling was captured, which means that we didn't need to install any unsightly surface conduits."

Ergo Group's portfolio includes the refurbishment of the Sydney Opera House Function Centre, the Australian Museum and the Art Gallery of New South Wales. In addition, the company has several ongoing projects in venues all around the State from hospitals and schools, to retail outlets and hospitality venues.

A total of approximately 34,500m³ of bulk excavation and 600m³ of detailed excavation were carried out by Chalouhi throughout the duration of the project.

Chalouhi's inhouse design team was critical to the progression of works as they provided and implemented a tailored shoring solution suiting the unique challenges of the project. Design coordination and changes were made to meet the requirement of easement underground services of Sydney Water Assets and sequencing of utility diversion works.

The team met the technical demands from various utility providers, council bodies, architects, structural engineers and other stakeholders whilst taking measures to maintain continued and safe pedestrian access to the neighbouring Lindfield Corporate Centre.



"A typical, grey gravel carpark has been transformed into an appealing green area and it has completely changed the town centre and given the local residents an attractive parkside location."

Attention-to-detail was the main focus for Rockcrete, as was deploying the right people to do a quality job and meet all the requirements, which included the supply of an internal, 33m tower boom where there was limited access onsite.
